I. Diabetes Alliance Network

Dr. Angelina Bernier came as a guest to inform parents about a new program by the University of Florida. The program will be for children from less affluent families with diabetes or other endocrine system disorders. UF understands that access to care can be difficult and time-consuming and has put together a team of experts to provide telemedicine services. Families who lack adequate access to internet-connected devices will get telemedicine kits, including iPads with Wi-Fi access and continuous glucose monitors. UF plans to target underinsured or uninsured families and those who are part of the migrant worker population in Collier County.

II. Parent & Family Engagement Plan

Mrs. Quintero and Ms. Garcia presented the 2020-2021 Parent and Family Engagement Policy to all SAC members. They asked parents to provide feedback, specifically if they what any changes or additions to the plan.
