RCMA Wimauma Comm Academy enjoys relationships with many community partners. One relationship that was established in 2017 and has continued this past month is our relationship with a local university, Gannon University. Gannon U is located in Ruskin, and offers multiple health-care related advanced college degrees. Occupational Therapy degree students visited the campus and worked with first graders and fourth grades on Tues. Gannon's OT students developed various "stations" where scholars learned practical knowledge using hands-on activities. Some of the stations in first grade were - internet safety, guessing the sugar content of common foods, and sequencing the steps in good hygiene. Examples of stations in fourth grade included - learning about why washing hands thoroughly is important, foods and which food group they belong in, and exercising for good health. All students in each grade level were able to experience each station, by rotating every 8 min. through the stations.

A total of two Gannon University OT professors and 25 students planned and executed the activities! Teachers and scholars were pleased with the experience. We invited them to come back to our school next semester as well.
