AS PART OF THEIR THREE YEAR STRATEGIC PLANNING, THE RCMA BOARD OF DIRECTORS ALSO IDENTIFIED THE NEED TO IMPROVE OUR ABILITY TO RETAIN TEACHERS AND FAMILY SUPPORT WORKERS IN JULY 2019.
